

Parry Sound, Ontario

Located 220km north of Toronto; 150 km southwest of North Bay

Community Information:

Located in northern Ontario on the eastern shore of the sound after which it is named — just
off Georgian Bay.

Population:

Approximately 6,300 year round residents, and approximately 18,000 seasonal/summer residents

Small Town Canada - Notable Features:

- Parry Sound is rich in arts, culture and heritage and is world-renowned as the hometown of hockey legend Bobby Orr.
- Popular cottage country destination
- World's deepest freshwater port
- During the early part of the 20th century, the area was a popular subject for the many scenic art works of Tom Thomson and members of the artistic "Group of Seven"
- Coastline is home to the Georgian Bay Biosphere Reserve, one of only 13 UNESCO sites in Canada
